

I heard that patients had to come to the hospital at 4 am to see a doctor in the noon. Surprisingly, in each pediatrics outpatient room, 4 patients took medical advice from doctors at the same time. Although it is hard to do the same thing in Japan because of the patient privacy problem, I think it was a nice system. Because doctors can share the patients' information and discuss about physical findings, diagnosis and treatment.

## Pediatrics

In first and second weeks, I practiced in a pediatrics department. I could see a lot of patients in the hospital. Some patients suffered from Dengue fever, HIV, thalassemia and tuberculosis. We seldom see these patients in Japan. Thus Japanese doctors have few opportunities to take physical findings from these patients. As a matter of fact, I had never seen these patients in Japan when I met the patients. It was a various experience for me to study in Indonesia. The doctors explained how to take physical findings to me. It was hard for me to understand all the things they said because of my lack of English skills. But doctors sometimes showed pictures and did to the patients actually. It really helped me to understand. I also studied about the diseases after school. In result, I was able to know a lot of diseases in Indonesia.

In third and fourth weeks, I studied in Cardio thorax and Urology divisions. In the cardio thorax division, the doctors perform two operations in a day. Because they have smaller organs, which means surgeons have to perform with minute attention. There are another problem. Doctors can stop hearts with a heart lung machine. But children are premature, so they must be performed operations as soon as possible. The doctor who taught me said that the most important thing is to perform accurately. He also said surgeons have to know themselves. They must not do the operations beyond their real skills.
