# Exchange Program 2014

Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University, Thailand

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#### 1. Introduction

First of all, I want to thank all the people who helped me having such a wonderful opportunity in Thailand. I spent only 4 weeks in Thailand, but these 4 weeks were filled with a lot of fun and excitements. I spent 2 weeks in Infectious disease department and the other 2 weeks in Family medicine department. # 2. Ramathibodi Hospital

Ramathibodi hospital is one of the biggest hospital in Bangkok, which is a university hospital of Mahidol university. There are more than 3 buildings.





It was so big that I would be lost if I was alone. It serves at least 5000 patients a day.

Some parts of the hospital didn't have any air conditioning because of tuberculosis. Some facilities were very new, but the others were old and they used

many different

things because Thailand doesn't have a lot of money for healthcare (this is what I heard). One of the different things at Ramathibodi hospital is that there is a place to pray.

There are many good facilities like a sport gym, a cafeteria, a ground for futsal, basketball, volleyball, and so on. There are also library and PC room.



I stayed in the dormitory. In the room, there were a refrigerator, 4 beds (for only me!), a shower (no hot water!), and TV (but I had no idea what the TV show is about).

## 3. Infectious disease department

In ID department, I joined Professor Ken's round with 2 other students everyday. Doctors in ID department explained about patients in English for us, so we could understand what they were doing or what they were thinking. There were a lot of patients with tuberculosis or HIV. In each



round, Professor Ken gave us questions which were really hard to solve. Sometimes, we couldn't answer, so we went to the library to research. He and other doctors were so nice that they taught us a lot. We had a really good opportunity to learn about ID.
