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I am a second-year student in the doctoral degree course in Osaka University Graduate School of Medicine. I am specializing in infectious diseases and conducting research on multi-drug resistant organisms. I studied at Bangkok through the program of 'Education of Global Medical and Health Science Leaders in the Coming Generation in Cooperation and Collaboration with ASEAN Countries.'
